This spring also brought an extraordinary gift — one that will have a lasting impact on our students and our campus. We are honored to announce a \$5.5 million commitment from **David Thies B'59** and his wife, **Marlys** that includes the largest contribution allocated to athletics in our university's history.

This transformational gift will support a comprehensive renovation of our campus gymnasium, which will be rededicated as the **David R. Thies B'59 Arena**. More than a facility upgrade, this gift is a tribute to David's legacy as a two-sport student-athlete and a lifelong champion of Saint Mary's.

In sharing his reasons for the gift, David recalled arriving on campus in the late 1950s and feeling immediately at home: "Saint Mary's felt like it was a warm place and the right place for me. I just felt a comfort at Saint Mary's, and I have ever since."
