What types of authentic learning environments can help re-engage learners?

"Saint Mary's was one of the pioneers in the region with online learning within our Schools of Graduate and Professional Programs. With the pandemic, all institutions were forced to move to online learning. Overnight, those of us who were early movers in online education lost one of our competitive advantages. It compelled us to think even more creatively about what we can do to continue to attract new students with new and more relevant offerings in business and technology. We were in progress with developing graduate certificates before the pandemic. These certificates allow students to invest in 12 credits instead of a full master's degree. We combined digital badging with it to help students communicate their knowledge to current and future employers. We have countless stories of people who have switched jobs and accelerated their careers by attaining a certificate. It's about helping students dip a toe into the water and then providing them with the possibility of pathways from there. By allowing credentials to stack, students have more flexibility in how they achieve their educational goals. For example, a student could earn a certificate in Project Management and then choose to stack it into the MBA, MS in Project Management, or another specialized master's degree."
